Chair Lily N. Morgan called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

1. Judge McGlaughlin Introduction

The Board and Judge McGlaughlin made introductions to each other and discussed Judge McGlaughlin's expectations. Commissioner Morgan discussed the interactions between County and State Courts and who provides/funds space and who provides/funds services and/or employees. The Board discussed the District Attorney and that position's functions, public records requests, and Dog Control Board. Commissioner Morgan discussed Drug Court, tickets, restorative justice, school resource officers, domestic violence, and Association of Oregon Counties (AOC). Mr. Hicks, County Legal Counsel, offered the Law Libraries services of research to Judge McGlaughlin. Judge McGlaughlin inquired about the relationship that exists between herself and the Board of County Commissioners, Commissioner Morgan stated that there are at times where there is collaboration between the Judges and the Board depending on projects and the network that each holds. Judge McGlaughlin inquired on what judges can do in general that will help the community feel that judges are not on bigger cities or state agendas and in fact enforcing local laws. Judge McGlaughlin and the Board discussed citations, paying those off, and different options available to people of lower economic status. Commissioner Morgan discussed how the Courts now supervise misdemeanors.
